## Actions which are directed to be taken are not all that may be required of the kennel operator to come into compliance. The kennel operator is responsible for taking any and all actions necessary to come into compliance.

The inspection of the kennel took place on July 27, 2021. There were 101 adult dogs and 2 puppies located on the premises at the time of this inspection. There were 21 adult dogs and 4 puppies listed in rescue kennel network homes at the time of this inspection. The 2021 kennel license was viewed along with the state forms exemption letter. The inspection was performed with State Veterinarian, Dr. Ward.

The inspection of July 27, 2021 is as follows:

207(b) / 21.28(d) - Bedding Cleanliness:

Warden observed urine-soaked bedding in multiple enclosures that were housing dogs at the time of this inspection.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

If bedding is used in primary enclosures, it shall be kept clean.

207(b) / 21.29(b) - Sanitation:

Warden observed multiple enclosures housing dogs that were not being sanitized as often as is necessary, as evidenced by the accumulation of excreta, soiled bedding, and rodent feces.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):



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Primary enclosures for dogs shall be sanitized a minimum of once daily, and as often as is necessary to prevent an accumulation of debris or excreta or a disease hazard. A dog may not be placed in a primary enclosure previously occupied unless the enclosure has been sanitized.

207(b) / 21.29(c) - Housekeeping/Pests:

Warden observed rodent feces on the floor along the building walls, in the grooming room on the floor and in baskets, and in two enclosures that were housing dogs. Warden also observed an accumulation of food, kong toys, and food bowls underneath the primary enclosures which encourage the presence of pests. Warden viewed bedding materials, used rubber gloves, and other trash in the kennel room on the floor as well as in the grooming room; all these items encourage the presence of pests. Warden observed multiple piles of old feces in two of the small outdoor exercise yards. Warden witnessed new dogs being put in these areas without previously removed old feces. This could contribute to the spread of fecal borne diseases and attracts and encourages rodents and other pests.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

The buildings and grounds of kennels shall be maintained, kept clean and in good repair to protect the animal from injury and to facilitate practices required by this chapter. Kennels shall have an effective program that controls ingress by insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests. Evidence of insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests or conditions that would allow or encourage infestation in a kennel are indicative of an ineffective program and unsanitary environmental sanitation in the kennel.

207(c) / 21.41(a) - Records Kept:

Warden did not receive complete kennel records for the dogs on the premises during the inspection.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

Complete records shall be kept on dogs within a kennel or being transported in a primary conveyance as prescribed by section 207 of the act (3 P. S. \$459-207), and the records shall be kept at the kennel location or, when applicable, shall accompany dogs being transported.

Every keeper of a kennel shall keep, for two years, a record of each dog at any time kept in the kennel. Such record shall show:

- (1) The breed, color, markings, sex and age of each dog.
- (2) The date on which each dog entered the kennel.
- (3) The full name and physical address at the time the dogs were received of the previous owner or kennel from whom the dog was received. This paragraph shall not apply to a boarding kennel.
- (4) The full name and physical address of the person or kennel to whom the dog belongs.
- (5) For what purpose each dog is kept in the kennel.
- (6) The date on which each dog leaves the kennel.
- (7) How the dog is dispensed. If the dog was transferred to another person or kennel, the record must state the full name and physical address of the person or kennel to whom the dog was dispensed.
- (8) The name, address and telephone number of the licensed doctor of veterinary medicine used by the kennel. Such record shall be legible and shall be open to inspection and may be copied by any employee of the department, State dog warden or police officer as defined by this act.

402(d) - Vet Check:

Veterinary examinations were ordered on dogs under section 402(a) based on warden's observations of the condition of dogs during inspection. Kennel is in compliance with section 402(d) because veterinary examination was completed within the 72-hour time frame.

- \*A referral for cruelty was made based on the sanitation issues during this inspection. \*
