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Remarks

***Actions which are directed to be taken are not all that may be required of the kennel operator to come into compliance.
The kennel operator is responsible for taking any and all actions necessary to come into compliance.***

The inspection of the kennel took place on September 14, 2018. There were 143 adult dogs and 0 puppies located on the premises at the time of this inspection. There were 25 adult dogs and 10 puppies listed in rescue kennel network homes at the time of this inspection. The 2018 kennel license was viewed along with the state forms exemption letter. The inspection was performed with State Veterinarian, Dr. Ward.

The inspection of September 14, 2018 is as follows:

207(b) / 21.29(c):

Warden viewed rodent feces inside primary enclosures where dogs were being housed as well as on the floor along the building walls and underneath the primary enclosures.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

The buildings and grounds of kennels shall be maintained, kept clean and in good repair to protect the animal from injury and to facilitate practices required by this chapter. Kennels shall have an effective program that controls ingress by insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests. Evidence of insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests or conditions that would allow or encourage infestation in a kennel are indicative of an ineffective program and unsanitary environmental sanitation in the kennel.

The kennel has had a pest control company inspect the building and provide a pest reduction plan. However, not all aspects of the plan are being complied with, specifically repairs that need to be made to various areas of the building by the property owner. Comply with all areas of the pest reduction plan.

21.30 Condition of Dog:

Warden and Dog Law Veterinarian observed 4 dogs in the shelter that appeared to be exhibiting signs of poor health. Two dogs were found to have moderate to severe matting. The severely matted dog was a Poodle-type dog that had extensive matting over his face, chest, dorsum (back), ventrum (belly) and legs. Another dog, a Pomeranian-type, was observed to have a significant, nearly constant, cough, likely caused by a collapsing trachea (windpipe). Collapsing trachea can lead to dyspnea (labored breathing) and the need for urgent veterinary attention. A Pit bull-type dog was seen with an open, bleeding wound to his tail with blood staining to both walls of his enclosure. The injury to the tail of this dog appeared to be a recent occurrence. Finally, another dog was observed to have significantly overgrown nails.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

An employee of the Department may visually observe the physical condition of a dog sheltered at a kennel. A dog sheltered at a kennel shall be free of infectious and contagious diseases, and shall be in general good health. If a dog exhibits signs of poor health, the kennel owner shall have proof of adequate veterinary care for the dog.

Have matted dogs, especially severely matted dog, groomed as soon as possible to avoid unnecessary pain, and/or dermatologic irritation and infection. Treat dermatologic conditions that may be present once matted fur is removed.

Start medically necessary treatment for Pomeranian-type dog to decrease dogs' coughing which will both improve dogs' comfort level and avoid unnecessary emergent care.

Treat and bandage Pitbull terrier-type dog's tail to decrease ongoing trauma to the tail and consider surgical intervention if necessary. Move dog to enclosure with soft walls or soft crate to attempt to decrease firmness of material dog is banging tail against. Start appropriate pain medications.

Trim dog's nails immediately to avoid unnecessary pain from breakage.
