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Remarks

***Actions which are directed to be taken are not all that may be required of the kennel operator to come into compliance.
The kennel operator is responsible for taking any and all actions necessary to come into compliance.***

The inspection of the kennel took place on October 23, 2018. There were 116 adult dogs and 0 puppies located on the premises at the time of this inspection. There were 34 adult dogs listed in rescue kennel network homes at the time of this inspection. The 2018 kennel license was viewed along with the state forms exemption letter. The inspection was performed with State Veterinarian, Dr. Ward.

The inspection of October 23, 2018 is as follows:

207(b) / 21.21(a) - Maintenance:

Warden observed damaged chainlink fencing, holes in the walls of two primary enclosures, and a hole in the wall of the housing facility.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

Indoor and outdoor housing facilities for dogs shall be maintained in a manner to protect the dogs from injury and to contain the dogs.

207(b) / 21.29(c) - Housekeeping/Pests:

Warden observed rodent feces on the floor along the building walls and underneath the primary enclosures. Warden also observed an accumulation of food, kong toys, and food bowls underneath the primary enclosures which could encourage the presence of pests. Warden observed the back corner of the building was cluttered with old files and other miscellaneous hazardous materials which could also encourage pests.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

The buildings and grounds of kennels shall be maintained, kept clean and in good repair to protect the animal from injury and to facilitate practices required by this chapter. Kennels shall have an effective program that controls ingress by insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests. Evidence of insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests or conditions that would allow or encourage infestation in a kennel are indicative of an ineffective program and unsanitary environmental sanitation in the kennel.

21.30 Condition of dog:

Warden and Dog Law Veterinarian observed multiple dogs to have significantly overgrown toenails. The temperament of these dogs seemed cooperative and there was no known reason as to why the toenails have not been trimmed. Another dog was observed to have been in the kennel for 10 days and had a grape-sized mammary mass, severe hyperplasia, and dark brown discharge in both ears. There was no indication that this dog had received treatment for the mentioned issues.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

An employee of the Department may visually observe the physical condition of a dog sheltered at a kennel. A dog sheltered at a kennel shall be free of infectious and contagious diseases, and shall be in general good health. If a dog exhibits signs of poor health, the kennel owner shall have proof of adequate veterinary care for the dog.

402(d):

Veterinary examinations were ordered on dogs under section 402(a) based on warden's observations of the condition of dogs during inspection. Kennel is in compliance with section 402(d) because veterinary examinations were completed within the 72 hour time frame.

**A follow-up inspection will take place at a later date and time.
