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Remarks

## Actions which are directed to be taken are not all that may be required of the kennel operator to come into compliance. The kennel operator is responsible for taking any and all actions necessary to come into compliance.

The inspection of the kennel took place on February 26, 2019. There were 130 adult dogs and 4 puppies located on the premises at the time of this inspection. There were 25 adult dogs and 3 puppies listed in rescue kennel network homes at the time of this inspection. The 2018 kennel license was viewed along with the state forms exemption letter. The 2019 kennel license is pending approval. The inspection was performed with State Veterinarian, Dr. Ward and Warden Caskey.

The inspection of February 26, 2019 is as follows:

207(b) / 21.21(a) - Maintenance:

Warden observed a chewed and damaged wall in "Princess Apple Sky's" enclosure.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

Indoor and outdoor housing facilities for dogs shall be maintained in a manner to protect the dogs from injury and to contain the dogs.

207(b) / 21.21(c) - Drainage:

Warden observed standing water in primary enclosures housing dogs, especially on the dog beds.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

Adequate drains shall be provided to rapidly eliminate excess water from housing facilities.

207(b) / 21.29(c) - Housekeeping/Pests:

Warden observed rodent feces on the floor along the building walls and underneath the primary enclosures. Warden also observed an accumulation of food, kong toys, and food bowls underneath the primary enclosures which could encourage the presence of pests. Warden observed an accumulation of dirt, old food, and debris under the sinks in the small wash room. Warden observed & dead, water logged rodent behind a set of enclosures. Warden observed cloth toys in outdoor exercise areas that were wet and dirty which could encourage bacteria.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

The buildings and grounds of kennels shall be maintained, kept clean and in good repair to protect the animal from injury and to facilitate practices required by this chapter. Kennels shall have an effective program that controls ingress by insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests. Evidence of insects, ectoparasites and avian and mammalian pests or conditions that would allow or encourage infestation in a kennel are indicative of an ineffective program and unsanitary environmental sanitation in the kennel.

Reg Other - 21.30 Condition of Dog:

"Speedy", a male, adult, black and white Lhasa Apso-type dog, was observed with severe matting on his legs, neck, ventral abdomen and back end. Closer evaluation revealed a large matt on his right, ventral neck down to the skin and a reluctance to raise his head. The matts on his legs were also down the skin and ran the entire length of his legs. He attempted to move away from us when we palpated the matts on his legs which we saw as a sign of discomfort. He was also observed licking at the matts on his legs often in his enclosure. For the above reasons this dog was ordered to have a veterinary examination, and a cruelty referral was made to the Pennsylvania SPCA.

This warden directs that the kennel operator take the following action(s):

An employee of the Department may visually observe the physical condition of a dog sheltered at a kennel. A dog sheltered at a kennel shall be free of infectious and contagious diseases, and shall be in general good health. If a dog exhibits signs of poor health, the kennel owner shall have proof of adequate veterinary care for the dog.

402(d):

A veterinary examination was ordered on a dog under section 402(a) based on warden's observations of the condition of dogs during inspection. Kennel is in compliance with section 402(d) because veterinary examination was completed within the 72 hour time frame.

\*\*A follow-up inspection will take place at a later date and time.
